SEESAW On Line Safety advice

The teachers will delete immediately and we will contact you of anything that would not be acceptable in a school situation. So please only pictures of your children carrying out activities that have been set by the teacher or similar to ones that might be done in school e.g. baking, gardening, painting. Please be mindful of the setting where the activity takes place, rooms like bathrooms and bedrooms are inappropriate for reasons I am sure you will understand.
